1. NATIONAL ITORERO

Itorero is a national civic education program aimed at cultivating a spirit of patriotism, heroism, and noble values among Rwandans. In his address on 14 November 2007, His Excellency the President of the Republic described Itorero in these words:

“

The National Itorero served as a school dedicated to cultivating patriotism among Rwandans, instilling the values of responsible leadership, the pursuit of heroism, integrity, unity in problem-solving, and the rejection of divisionism, among other noble principles.

”



The National Itorero operates at four main levels: village communities, schools, workplaces, and special categories. The latter undergo their training annually at the National Ubutore Development Centre (NUDC) in Nkumba, Burera District.

The training program promotes Rwandan cultural values and taboos, strengthens participants' resilience in the face of life's challenges, and provides knowledge of Rwanda's historical journey and future aspirations. Through this process, participants are empowered to engage meaningfully in national development and unity-building efforts.



2. KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

Following the 1994 Genocide against the Tutsi, Rwandans drew from their cultural heritage to develop civic responsibility and seek homegrown solutions to the many challenges the country faced. Among the initiatives established was the revival of the Itorero ry'Igihugu (National Itorero), through which Rwandans gain knowledge about their nation's history and culture and are encouraged to actively participate in national development.

On 16 November 2007, His Excellency President Paul Kagame officially launched the National Itorero before both chambers of Parliament. In his address, He stated:

“

We are launching the National Itorero program as a uniquely Rwandan initiative rooted in our culture. The Itorero was a school for training and educating Rwandans to love their country, lead it responsibly, strive for heroism, reject dishonesty, collaborate in solving problems, and avoid divisionism, among other values.

”

The Itorero aligns with Rwanda's Vision 2050, which aims to transform the country from a lower income to a high-income economy. This transformation is to be achieved by promoting values that support economic and social development, including self-reliance and sovereignty, dignity, unity and national identity, integrity and loyalty, gender equality, transparency and freedom, civic participation, good governance and accountability, public service engagement, innovation, and the pursuit of national stability.

Additionally, Itorero supports the National Strategy for Transformation (NST2: 2024–2029) by contributing to improved citizen welfare, promoting Rwandan culture and values as foundations for peace and unity, and increasing citizens' participation, volunteerism, and collaboration in national development.

The National Itorero was reintroduced in 2007, followed by the establishment of the National Itorero Commission under Law No. 41/2013 of 16 June 2013. In 2021, Itorero was placed under the mandate of the Ministry of National Unity and Civic Engagement (MINUBUMWE) through Ministerial Order No. 21/03 of 21 October 2021.

Key achievements to date include:

- In 2021, the National Itorero was designated as part of the mission and responsibilities of MINUBUMWE, as stipulated in Ministerial Order No. 21/03 of 21 October 2021
- Organisation of Itorero structure (Ingamba, Isibo, Village, schools, institutions, and special categories)
- Organization and implementation of National Service (Urugerero) for high school graduates
- Itorero has enhanced understanding of Rwandan history and cultural values, and has promoted national unity, social cohesion, and peaceful coexistence among Rwandans from all walks of life
- Enhancing the functioning of Itorero at local administrative levels and establishing its structure from the village to the district level
- Strengthening the capacity of cell executive secretaries

3. ITORERO INDANGAMIRWA BACKGROUND

Itorero Indangamirwa program fosters civic education to Rwandan youth aged 18-25, including Diaspora, international school students in Rwanda and best performers at National Service. Established in 2008, Itorero Indangamirwa has trained 5,561 young Rwandans across 15 cohorts to date. The 15th edition of Itorero Indangamirwa took place from 1 July to 14 August 2025, at the NUDC, in Nkumba, Burera District, Northern province.

Youth feedback across cohorts affirms that Itorero Indangamirwa deepens their understanding of Rwanda's history, instills national values, and inspires patriotism. It equips them to serve as informed, and engaged ambassadors of the country's vision.



4. OBJECTIVES FOR ITORERO INDANGAMIRWA 15

- To instill values and taboos of Rwandan culture among the youth
- To build resilience in the face of life's challenges
- To promote Rwanda's interests both locally and internationally
- To deepen understanding of Rwanda's history and vision, while engaging youth in national development.

5. PARTICIPANTS FOR ITORERO INDANGAMIRWA 15

The 15th cohort of Itorero Indangamirwa convened 443 youth participants, including:

- Rwandan students residing or studying abroad
- Graduates from international secondary schools within Rwanda
- Outstanding youth (Indashyikirwa) from the 12th cohort of National Service (Urugerero rw'Inkomezabigwi) from all 30 districts.



7. PATRIOTISM SESSIONS

Indangamirwa 15 received lessons on patriotism and basic military training. Courses in this category included map reading, national defense strategies, martial arts, military parades, educational site visits to memorials and museums, and sustaining national development achievements.



8. IGITARAMO

Each evening features Igitaramo, a cultural night dedicated to learning about and showcasing Rwandan traditions such as singing, dancing, poetry, drumming, and storytelling. It is a moment for Intore to deepen their understanding of national cultural values and to reflect on how they contribute to Rwanda's transformation.



9. METHODOLOGY

The sessions were delivered using a blended approach that incorporated the following methods:

- **Lectures:** Led by individual speakers providing in-depth insights on key topics
- **Panel Discussions:** Featuring multiple panelists offering diverse perspectives and expert opinions
- **Practical Exercises and Group Work:** Interactive, hands-on activities designed to promote collaboration, problem-solving, and critical thinking
- **Cultural Performances and Entertainment:** Artistic expressions used to engage participants and reinforce key messages in an inspiring and memorable way
- **Site visits:** to memorials and museums to improve their understanding of the national history and Rwanda's liberation and transformation journey.
